Letter from John Cothern Senior Vice President

As you may expect, it is with much concern that I start this message with the budget situation that we have faced and will continue to face for the next several years. A blessing though is what appears for now to be a reprieve with the federal stimulus funds that will provide some support for two years.

I hope that you were able to attend one of President McPhee's Public Forums on the budget reductions and made suggestions to the Work Groups that he appointed. It is very important that everyone participate in the process. Much is still to be determined about how budget reductions will be made.

As you have surely read or heard by now, our state appropriation reduction will be \$19.3 million. Increased students fees will not be large enough to fully cover the reduction. Therefore, budget cuts are a reality. With the federal funds, layoffs will not be part of what has to take place immediately, and voluntary buyouts will be considered. Every effort will be made to minimize the effect on employees.

Especially with the current budget situation, your support is more than ever needed and appreciated including your continued support for the Image Committee and the Business and Finance Council. We need to hear about your concerns and recommendations.

Even though we will be faced with many hard and difficult decisions, we will work through the challenges and come out better in the long run. Please keep a positive outlook.

Also, notwithstanding the budget concerns, I feel that we should still have our Employee Appreciation Day. The cost, however, will be paid with Foundation funds and not University operating funds. Although it may only be a small token to say thanks for the work that you do, it is important that we occasionally come together to visit and renew and maybe even begin friendships.

As I know you always do, please be sure to thank our students for making MTSU their university.

And thanks for being a Business and Finance Can Do Crew member.
